WILLIAMS, Mr. W. C - Age 83, passed away Saturday, March 28, 2026, at Argentine Care Center, Linden, Michigan. Family Hour 1:30 PM Saturday, April 18, 2026, from the Chapel of Lawrence E. Mr. Walter Charles Williams, affectionately known to all as “Dub”, was born on December 17, 1942, in Madison County, Mississippi. He was the youngest of nine children born to the union of Mr. Willie and Amanda Williams. From his earliest days on the family farm, W.C. was no stranger to the soil or the toil; he was a child of the earth who understood that harvest only comes to those who are willing to plant.

In 1961, following the path of the Great Migration, W.C. relocated to Flint, Michigan, seeking the promise of the Industrial North. He gained employment with Buick Motors Company, where he became a fixture of reliability. For approximately 30 years, W.C. served faithfully in the Sanitation Division. His work ethic was legendary-he was a man who never saw a “late” clock and

never missed a day of service. He lived by the creed “cleanliness is next to godliness,” and he applied that standard not just to the factory floor, but to every corner of his life.

W.C. was a man of distinct presence. He took immense pride in his appearance, always dressing to impress. He was his own tailor, adjusting his clothing to fit his personal sense of style-(short sleeves for readiness and hemlines cut above the ankle) for comfort and flair. When the music played, W.C. was in his element. Whether it was the smooth crooning of “Sam Cook”, the soulful grit of “Bobby Blue Bland”, or the harmonies of The Temptations, he possessed a rhythm that couldn’t be taught. He loved good food, rummage sales and dancing, the joy of travel, and the art of the dance. The sharing of his time and talents was endless.

W.C. loved his family. Though he had no biological children of his own, his home and heart were never empty. There were many he met over the years whom he kept close and adopted into the fold. Being mild-mannered and of a cheerful nature, he was a father to many and the “Uncle to All.” W.C. was the first to lend a hand and the last to leave your side in times of need. He garnered a special place in his heart for children, offering them the same big-hearted love he gave to everyone he met.
