Mrs. Willie Mae Page was born April 5, 1929 in East St. Louis, Missouri to John Henry Young and Mariah Randle Jefferson. Her early years were spent in Starksville, MS. She came to Flint, MI at age seven. Mrs. Page attended Fairview Elementary School, Lowell Junior High and Northern High School. She married Adolphus Bivins and to that union two sons were born—Glenn Martin Bivins and Arthur Douglas Bivins. She later married Corley Page and was a loving wife and mother. While in Flint, she worked 11 years for Ternstedt, a Division of General Motors Corporation. She relocated from Flint to Rock Island, Illinois in 1973, where she worked for John Deere for approximately 20 years until she retired. She accepted Christ at an early age at New Zion Missionary Baptist Church under the Pastorage of Rev L. C. White. After moving to Rock Island, IL she united with First Paradise Baptist Church and served faithfully as Sunday School Superintendent, a youth

worker, and a soloist in the Choir. She was a Christian woman who encouraged everyone she met to accept Jesus Christ as their Saviour and to become one of His disciples. She was truly serious about her evangelistic work. Her hobbies were gardening, collecting caps, reading the Bible as an Evangelist and caring for her beloved dogs and cats. She was a dignified, well-mannered and classy lady at all times, no matter when you saw her. She resided in Rock Island for 41 years until Mid-May of 2014 when she moved back to Flint to be close to her two sons due to her illness, and went on home to Heaven on Wednesday morning, May 28, 2014.
